

The season of Advent in our church means singing carols, flickering candlelight, children's wideeyed awe, and joyful celebration. May you and your family enjoy all the goodness and peace the season offers you. Absorb it all!

On November 17th, Consistory, Property, and Cemetery Committees met once again to discuss the outcomes of the Congregational Survey and how to best proceed. The survey has generated substantial internal momentum. Using sensitivity and careful thought we hope to maintain this momentum in a positive direction. We will utilizing those best knowledgeable concerning Zwingli and the cemetery. It is easy to get caught up in the emotional aspect of maintaining these properties, but reality has not been kind to our old building and upkeep of the cemetery has become financially unworkable.

In the January Spire you will receive a congregational voting ballot. Two voting ballots will be sent. Additional votes can be photocopied or picked up at the church office. We also hope to have online voting available. It is extremely important that our 25-50 age group become involved. Your voice is essential to guaranteeing the health and future of our church. By our Annual Meeting, February 11th, votes will be counted and data analyzed. The challenges which result from our vote may seem daunting, not unlike our ancestors' building concerns; but certainly, they would be cheering us on in our mission to bring our congregation and community together.

Poinsettias for Christmas

The poinsettias have been ordered and will grace our church with their vibrant colors during the Christmas season. There is no denying that poinsettias make bright, festive decorations during the winter months. But do you know the story behind them? They have been a tradition for years. Did you know they're native to Central America, particularly southern Mexico, and they're actually colorful leaves, not flowers. So why do we consider them the official Christmas flower?

The reason we associate poinsettias with the holidays comes from an old Mexican legend. A young girl named Pepita was sad that she didn't have a gift to offer for the baby Jesus at Christmas Eve services. Her cousin tried to comfort her and said that "even the humblest gift, given in love, will be acceptable in His eyes." Having no money with which to buy a gift, Pepita picked a bouquet of weeds that she walked past on the way to church. When she got to the church, she left the bundle at the bottom of the nativity scene. Miraculously, the bundle of weeds transformed into beautiful red flowers—the Christmas colors of red and green! From that day on, they became known as "Flores de Noche Buena," or "Flowers of the Holy Night."



Our 2021 Kilby Season events were all incredible successes! When we began to make plans for our 2021 Kilby season, we had elected to not host a sit down Kilby Supper given the continued uncertainty with the pandemic. Instead, we focused our efforts on how best to maximize our ability to serve the greatest number of guests with either take out dinners, or at our food stand at the south church lawn. In all, we served 245 take-out and delivery dinners that evening. We also served over 400 people at our Taste of Kilby - Walking Swiss Meatball Stand throughout the day.

Needing Bread

"The disciples came to Jesus and said, "Send the crowds away, so they may go buy food." Jesus said, "You give them something to eat." — Matthew 14:15-16 excerpted (NRSV)

It used to be that if you didn't understand it, weren't baptized, didn't believe correctly, or weren't morally pure, you were barred from Communion. It was called "fencing the table." Everybody did it.

But these days some churches are unfencing. Completely. They say Jesus never turned anyone away from his table, so neither should we.

Never mind that Jesus was always a guest with no table of his own to welcome anyone to. Or that the early church emphatically excluded notorious sinners, the unbaptized, and heretics. Or that the church has consistently taught that Communion is for members. Only.

We're opening our tables anyway, even though we've never done it this way before. Really. Never.

Now many people once ruled out are coming. Little kids, unbaptized adults, intellectually disabled people, the weary, the sin-sick, the doubting, the curious—they're all coming.

Because they want it, this gift they can't explain, don't believe in correctly, or were told they don't deserve. They want it, this company for their loneliness, this healing for their estrangement, this home for their wandering, this approval for their very beings. This pardon. This love. This memory. This meeting. This mercy. This food.

Above all, this food. For a bottomless hunger.

And the church that's always needed to have all its theological ducks in a row before budging an inch; the church that's always gone to the wall for its beliefs and put others up against the wall for theirs; this obtuse yet still teachable church is finally starting to obey Jesus: "You give them something to eat."

There is so much hunger. The church has bread.

We don't have to be deserving. All we need is to need the bread. Thank you, Jesus.

Green Cares Food Pantry Donations



North Stairway Closed


