November 7th is All Saints' Day. It is

celebrated to commemorate all Christians, living and deceased. It is held to remember all those who have died who were members of a local church.


So how should we think of All Saints Day? The 1662 Book of Common Prayer says that this holiday stands for "the unity of Christians of all ages, countries, and races in Christ, and the perfection of that unity in heaven."

In worship on Sunday, November 7th at 9:00 am, Swiss UCC Church will celebrate All Saints Day with a special service for families to remember those who have died in the last year from November 1, 2020 to November 1, 2021. Pat Pluss will read the names of those who have passed. A family member is invited to come up to the altar and light a candle in remembrance of their loved one. At this service, let's not forget past-family members, friends, teachers, and others who had a significant role in your life.



Lucky You

By Quinn Caldwell | published on October 20, 2021

"Like a shadow spread upon the mountains a great and powerful army comes. Fire devours in front of them and behind them a flame burns. Before them the land is like the garden of Eden, but after them a desolate wilderness. Before them all peoples are in anguish." – Joel 2, excerpts (NRSV)

Lucky you, to be in the minority. The majority of people, throughout a majority of the world and a majority of history, have lived with this sort of threat hanging over them. Or lived with somebody who could tell them exactly what it was like.

Not just in history. You may not know how it is to have the shadow of armies blotting out the noonday sun, but plenty of people alive today do.
