



> "I love people who harness themselves, an ox to a heavy cart, who pull like water buffalo, with massive patience, who strain the mud and the muck to move things forward, who do what has to be done, again and again."

The survey that Consistory has prepared for the congregation will ask your thoughts on volunteerism and the effort you are willing to invest in the financial and physical health of our church. 

Devotional from UCC

Prone to Wander

By Tony Robinson | published on September 17, 2021

"All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way." – Isaiah 53:6 (NRSV)

There is a magnificent chorus in Handel's *Messiah* based on this text from Isaiah. Near the end of the chorus is a long series of intricate fugues among the several voices that keep repeating the line, "We have turned." The effect is striking, as the music describes in sound everyone turning and turning (like sheep) in new and different directions (but always astray).



One of the earliest and most abiding Christian

insights about human nature is that we were made for God but keep turning away. Just as flowers are "heliotropic," designed to turn toward the sun, so we humans are "theotropic," designed to turn toward God.

But somehow our natural theotropism has become faulty and broken. We are more likely to go astray, to turn to our own way, than to turn toward God.

But the good news is we have a still-seeking God who does not give up on us. It is true that we are "prone to wander." The phrase comes from Robert Robinson's powerful hymn, "Come, Thou fount of every blessing."

In that hymn Robinson also wrote this: "Jesus sought me when a stranger, wandering from the fold of God." He knew that, though we turn to our own way again and again, God keeps bringing us back.

Prayer

Seek us and find us, Still-Seeking God, and turn us back to you, the source of our life.

El Salvador Mission: All God's Children

Lidia and Oscar keep records, find new students, get students the things they need to attend school, and report about the status of returning students. They also send us letters from the students, although not every student will write a letter. This has been more difficult in the pandemic because the postal service in El Salvador has shut down sending letters to us.

Updates for 2021

- The students started the 2021 school year in classrooms but then the schools went back to remote learning, which means more expenses and difficulties for students and families.
- Most families don't have internet access so they have to rely on their parent's cell phone (if they had a
 cell phone) for school work. Some of your sponsorship money goes to pay for internet. Some for
 parents making copies of study guides and for paper to work off of.
- For university students, it is also to pay for internet access, transportation, and school fees.

When children drop out of the program, we automatically assign you a new student. As usual, the sponsorship amount is \$160 per child--\$120 of this is used to cover school expenses like books, supplies, uniforms, and shoes, with the remaining \$40 per child going to Oscar and Lidia for their expenses. We are not able to give extra money to individual children. However, Oscar and Lidia will use any extra donated funds for school programs, books, supplies, and transportation costs for some of the older children. Older students may have to travel far to their schools, or stay in cities away from their homes. If you would like to contribute to this extra fund, you may add **any additional amount to your sponsorship check**.

We ask that sponsors send a letter, written to your child(ren) and a photo(s). Letters may be written in English or Spanish (<u>translate.google.com</u> works fairly well to translate your letter into Spanish). All checks, letters, and photos need to be at the P.O. Box **by Monday**, **October 11**, **2021**. Getting finances organized and records updated takes time. We want to make sure the students have what they need before the school year starts, which is January for children in El Salvador.
