I hope you will plan ahead to share worship with me each week, as we look into God's holy word, grow in our faith, and celebrate the greatness of our God!




Men's Community Prayer Breakfast

- 2. Plots/deeds can be sold and transferred by individuals. Please note: the church should be notified of any transfers to maintain accurate records.



Swiss UCC Consistory Meeting January 25, 2023 Via Zoom

(Minutes Approved at Consistory Meeting on Feb. 21, 2023)

Attending: Bonnie Klassy, Guy Nelson, Shelly Johnson, Pam Venden, Nancy Galhouse, Rachel Baker, Tim Usher

Absent: Diana Clark, Tabatha Barnaby, Pat Pluss

Meeting called to order by Bonnie Klassy at 6:36 pm following a shared holiday dinner.

Approval of Agenda

Bonnie requested the following agenda additions – alter area updates and inclusion of Pat's pastoral report. Nancy Galhouse motioned to approve the updated agenda; second by Tim Usher. Motion carried.

Approval of Last Month's Minutes

Bonnie requested a revision to the minutes regarding the reporting radon level. It should be 6 (not 8 as stated). Shelly will adjust the minutes to reflect that correction. Motion by Nancy Galhouse to approve the December 14, 2022 meeting minutes with the noted correction; second by Rachel Baker. Motion carried.

Financial Report

- Guy Nelson presented the checks for approval. As there weren't any questions, a motion to approve was made by Shelly Johnson; second by Tim Usher. Motion carried.
- The Spire Report reviewed by Guy Nelson. CY 2022 Net Income was \$36,366. General fund balance after approved checks of \$93,822 and property fund balance of \$87,468. The variation of budget to actual was minimal (1.4% for income and just 1% for expenses).
- Offerings:
 - 1/15/2023 \$1,890 (\$1,755 General, \$135 Restricted)
 - 1/22/2023 \$3,380 (\$2,080 General, \$1,000 Property, \$300 Restricted)
- We discussed the potential of moving a portion of our \$75,000 cash reserve into a CD so that we can earn some interest. Given our strong operating funds and the fact that we have not had to dip into our emergency fund for several years, we agreed to move some of our money around in order to earn some interest income. A motion was made by Shelly Johnson to move

\$30,000 from our general fund into the cash reserve, leaving \$63,822 in the general fund. Then we would move \$50,000 from the cash reserve account and place it into a 1-year CD, leaving \$55,000 in the cash reserve. And finally, we would change the cash reserve account to a money market account; second by Bonnie Klassy. Motion carried.

• A question was also raised regarding the cemetery accounts. Guy Nelson clarified that the money in the cemetery savings comes from the sale of plots and burial fees; whereas the money in the cemetery checking account includes any cemetery designated donations along with the interest from our perpetual fund.

Committee Reports

Property Committee:

- Balcony & Narthex Repairs: Bonnie Klassy reported that the work is underway and that we
 received a bid from Mitch Rindy for \$1,050 to complete the painting after repairs are
 completed. The group discussed and the Property Committee agrees that it makes good sense
 to move forward with this bid as Rindy is already onsite doing the drywall and plaster work and
 has the equipment needed to complete the work. We further agreed that we should advise
 Rindy to move forward with the same colors as current. Motion by Nancy Galhouse to approve
 bid; second by Tim Usher. Motion carried.
- Radon Remediation: Bonnie Klassy reported that the remediation work continues. They're moving ahead with digging a larger/deeper hole, which they hope will bring the levels down from 6 to the desired 4 or less. There are continuous monitors placed in Fellowship Hall that will continue to monitor the radon levels over the next 3-4 months.
- Sprinkler & Alarm Repairs: Bonnie Klassy reported that Best Defense (monitors and alarms) and Monona Plumbing (sprinklers) will both be onsite tomorrow to complete their work.
- Altar Area Updates: Bonnie Klassy reported that the Property Committee has selected 3 wood flooring options for consideration. They are currently laying in the altar area at the front of the church if anyone would like to take a look and share their thoughts/preferences.

Pastoral Report (Pat Pluss)

While Pat was still off on vacation, she submitted the following written pastoral report.

- A men's prayer breakfast scheduled for Saturday, Feb. 4 8am.
- Sunday, Feb. 5 following worship I plan on having the confirmation kids prepare and deliver Valentine bags to our more isolated members.
- I have a lodge service scheduled for Feb 9-10am.
- Lead Mission committee on Feb. 10 we will be looking at 2023 missions.
- Meeting with my Conference Mentor Feb. 15 9am
- Confirmation Class students and mentors Feb. 15 6pm -7:30pm
- Annual meeting Feb. 19
- Ash Wed. Services Feb. 22 Lodge 10am, Home 10:45 am, Swiss 7pm
- Confirmation Class leading Ash Wed supper Feb. 22
- Staff meeting Feb. 23 9am
- ZOOM meeting with Rachel Bauman 10:30am
- Lenten Book Club 10am -11am

Also - please note our Swiss UCC Food Pantry is now having our guests choose their items from two large cupboards located near our entrance doors. Those using the pantry are also given a food voucher. We will continue to accept food items, as well as monetary donations. The shopping cart, used to collect donations, will be located in our Fellowship Hall. Our Ash Wednesday meal will be a fundraiser for the El Salvador student that the confirmation class sponsors and to help support the Ukrainian family in New Glarus.

Miscellaneous

- Confirmed candidates for Consistory: Jessica Swan, Ron Legler, Gary Krahenbuhl, Heidi Mondloch, and Bonnie Klassy (serving 1 additional year to help mentor new Consistory President).
- Annual Meeting details: We did not have time to address this topic due to the amount of time we spent talking with the attorney about the cemetery.
 - Outgoing recognition
 - Incoming introductions

<u>Cemetery Discussion</u> (Note – Nathan Russell from Russell Law Offices joined us via Zoom.)

- There was a brief introduction of attorney Russell who has been retained to assist us with the cemetery abandonment. Attorney Russell started by acknowledging that he received all of the information we provided and our list of questions, which he is prepared to discuss, but that he likely won't have answers for everything at this time. He indicated that the statutes on this topic are somewhat vague, and there is essentially no relevant case law.
- Please refer to the attached Q & A document for his responses.

2023 Budget

• Guy Nelson presented the proposed 2023 church budget. If anyone has questions or concerns, please reach out to him within the next week so he can be prepared for the upcoming Annual Meeting on 2/19/2023.

Motion to adjourn at 8:13 pm by Guy Nelson; seconded by Bonnie Klassy. Motion carried.
