

Meeting called to order by Nancy Galhouse at 6:30 pm.

Approval of Agenda

The following item was added to the agenda – discussion of church greeters. Shelly Johnson motioned to approve updated agenda; second by Heidi Mondloch. Motion carried.

Approval of Last Month's Minutes

The minutes from our February 21, 2023 meeting were already approved via email on March 13, 2023 so that the updated paperwork could be filed with the Bank of New Glarus for authorized signers. Rachel Baker motioned to approve the minutes; second by Shelly Johnson. Motion carried.

Financial Report

Net income ending February 28 is -\$480 which is better than the budgeted amount of -\$2,592 because January and February are historically low income months.

General Fund current balance is \$62,665. Property has a balance of \$77,098.

As treasurer, Shelly Johnson requested Marlis Silver to produce a Weekly Giving spreadsheet including General, Property, and Restricted donations with all cemetery entries eliminated. Year-to-date total of weekly giving is \$34,079.23.

Review of checks raised a question of why Quickbooks has an amount of 3,290.57. That is the total amount of the paychecks for three employees listed below the Quickbooks entry, not the cost of using Quickbooks.

Heidi Mondloch motioned to approve the checks; second by Tabatha Barnaby. Motion carried.

Family Promise

A Family Promise meeting will be held April 30 to update where the organization is going and if they will be potentially forging a relationship with Habitat for Humanity of Green County. They have a five-bedroom home in Monroe that accommodates residents, so hosting at Shepherd of the Hills is no

longer needed. We currently have a balance of approximately \$2,600 in our Family Promise account, and we must decide where the proceeds will be disbursed.

Planned Giving

Planned Giving recommends to Consistory that \$100 be transferred from Innovative Ministries to the Bike Rodeo for the purchase of sunscreen and lip gloss with the Swiss UCC name on them. Shelly Johnson motioned to transfer \$100 from Innovative Ministries to the Bike Rodeo; Nancy Galhouse second. Motion carried.

Secretarial Position

Rachel Baker moved that the secretarial position be shared between Jessica Swan recording for the Executive Committee meetings and Rachel Baker recording for the Consistory meetings. Second by Heidi Mondloch. Motion carried.

Requisition Procedures

Requisition procedures were discussed. They remain basically the same. Since we have abandoned the cemetery as of January 1, 2023, all vendors related to the cemetery have been removed from the blanket requisition spreadsheet and budgets. No amount has been budgeted for the cemetery. Motion by Rachel Baker, second by Nancy Galhouse to approve the list of vendors or organizations that are included in the blanket requisitions spreadsheet. Motion carried.


