A Message from Our Pastor, Pat Pluss...

On June 25th I shared a sermon on the parable of talents told by Jesus. To coincide with the scripture lesson and sermon of that day, an anonymous giver provided \$5 for each person in worship – with the challenge to take the \$5

or "talent" and add to it with either additional monetary talents, or natural talents that you have such as woodworking, painting, baking, or knitting and use it to bless someone.

The congregation got busy. Sixty-four people in worship that day, accepted the \$5. Many took that money and purchased supplies to create something wonderful. A bazaar was held to sell those items, it included everything from handmade book marks, to dish cloths, to baked goods! Others added additional money to the \$5 and blessed a wide variety of organizations that help those in need. Here are some of the recipients of the money that was shared: Second Harvest, Sugar River Senior Center, WisCares, St. Jude, Green Haven, NG Fire Dept., NG EMS, Compassion International, Keep WI Warm Green County, HOPE of the United Church of Christ, Green County Food Pantry, and Habitat for Humanity. Many of you also added to the 5 dollars and purchased school supplies for BBBS!

Originally **\$320.00** was given out in church with the challenge to increase it. I would say you met the challenge because to the best of my knowledge and with the help of Marlis (our financial secretary) keeping it straight – the total that was given to blessed others including the original \$320.00, was **\$2190.95!** I would say that is an awesome return on the money given, thank you for your generosity and creativity in giving!

Listen to the words Jesus spoke as He told the parable of talents found in **Matthew 25:23** *"Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things: I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!"* Continue to be creative using all the gifts "talents" God has given you – look for ways to bless others daily!

Cause for celebration – a car full of school supplies was given to Dane County BBBS and a check for \$530.00 was mailed to BBBS of Green County! Well done church!










Church News cont'd. from Pastor Pat Pluss . . .

Dear Swiss UCC members and friends,

As fall approaches and the kids return to school, I am finding myself reflecting on our Kilby traditions. We are a church that is blessed to be steeped in traditions that date back to 1850. Kilby celebrates both our history and our evolution as a church community, an embracing of the past and the future. Historically, mutton and honey were served, according to the Chicago Tribute (February 14, 1878). However, by 1950, the mutton had disappeared and was replaced by yeal meatballs and ham. Pear bread was soon added to the menu. Kilby is also a celebration of homecoming, historically of the farmers' return from the Swiss Alps; in the modern day, a return to school, Sunday School, confirmation class, and fall traditions. The Covid pandemic and the need for social distancing necessitated the change from a sit down Kilby supper to a very successful model of a meatball stand and pre-packaged Kilby meals. Time passes, we evolve, and yet, we still return home.


As we return to our roots and our heritage as the autumn equinox approaches, it's also necessary to take stock of the places we call "home." I was blessed in August to spend a week as co-director of Camp AweSum, one of our innovative UCC church camps that provides respite and recreation for families who have a child or young adult on the Autism Spectrum. This camp is held three to four weeks each summer at Moon Beach, our beautiful UCC church camp in St. Germain, Wisconsin. Camp AweSum is unique in that it provides a camping experience for the entire family, with staff providing respite care in the morning for the children (those with Autism and their siblings) and family recreational opportunities in the afternoons and evenings. For those of you who spent any time at summer camp, you know the magic that camp can offer. It is truly a place for campers to build community and develop life-long friendships. What I love the most about our UCC church camps is that they provide open and affirming opportunities to experience nature, community and faith, welcoming to all. They are the very definition of "home." Our UCC outdoor ministry provides traditional camp opportunities such as the Youth Faith Formation Weekend in early November that our confirmation students will have the opportunity to enjoy this year. Camps for guilters, bicyclists, and those who love to bake or want to learn to sail are also offered. However, newer camps were added in recent years

to support families who are providing care for a loved one with Dementia, a child/young adult with Autism AweSum) and other developmental (Camp disabilities (Wonder Camp). Camps are also available to support children touched by foster care and to support non-traditional families. It is a place where all are welcome and cared for, and while hiking in the woods or sitting by the lake, can hear that God is indeed still speaking. In order to help our church members connect with God while experiencing the wonder of nature, the consistory decided at the July meeting to provide for 50% of the cost of attending a UCC church camp, up to \$200 per year. More information about the UCC camps can be found at ucci.org. Camps are located in St. Germain WI, Ripon WI, and in Washington County, iust north of West Bend.

As we move toward autumn, let's honor the traditions of our history while we embrace change. Let's continue to celebrate our church family by serving our community, both through our wonderful Kilby meal, and through our radical hospitality to all.
