

(Oscar also supports 50 students plus)

In general, during this period, students are attending school and others are attending the university in person, for the most part. One of the main difficulties that the families of the students are facing this year has been the increase in the price of the food basket. Basic food which exceeds \$250.00, which means that in most cases families are prioritizing the purchase of food for their children in the case of the communities of Usulután. Another of the problems that the families of the students are facing is the drought for the cultivation of basic grains such as corn and beans, which represents a harsh



scenario since this situation impacts the small economy of the families who most of them do not have permanent employment.

Even with the difficulties that families face and thanks to the support of the church, there is a symbol of hope since this year two young people from the Los Niños De Dios program have graduated.

(Kinder and Primary School – 22; Elem. School – 16; High School – 7; Spec. Ed. -1; University – 6)

At the beginning of the year in the list of scholars was Yamileth Esmeralda Arias Cruz. She was sponsored by Heidi Mondlach, but this girl deceased on January 2023. She was suffering for many years of her kidneys, but she never stopped and was going to the school, was very sad for her family. This year all the students are coming to the school, nobody is at home, it is good!! Just some university students have some classes online.

I am always visiting communities and share with the families in our meetings and gatherings, I like and enjoy visiting communities because is good to know about how they are, if they are with some economic or health problems, for example Alvaro David and Emerson Danie López Pineda are twins but Alvaro David is deaf and can't speak and his mom every day goes to Cojutepeque City to the special School for Alvaro, they have to pay for bus and food.

Some of the university students (living in communities) has a lot of challenges, they have to leave from their communities around 4 or 5 o'clock in the morning to be at the university if they have classes online they have to go somewhere (some relatives or friends) to get internet and is more difficult for them to receive their classes.

Swiss UCC Consistory Minutes August 23, 2023

Attending: Kim Bright, Chris Kiesz, Rachel Baker, Ron Legler, Gary Krahenbuhl, Nancy Galhouse, Shelly Johnson, Tabatha Barnaby, Heidi Mondloch, Jessica Swan Attending Via Zoom: Pat Pluss

Meeting called to order by Kim Bright at 6:30 pm and Pat Pluss led us in prayer. A request was made that we discuss the possibility of getting air conditioning in the church. Kim will forward the request to the Property Committee.

Approval of Agenda

Heidi Mondloch moved to approve the agenda as presented; Shelly Johnson seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of July Minutes

Kim Bright moved to approve the June Consistory Meeting Minutes as presented; Tabatha Barnaby seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report by Shelly Johnson

July was another strong month financially for Swiss Church with income of \$20,846 (\$3301 above budget) and expenses of \$15,959 (\$3060 below budget), resulting in a Net Income for the month of \$4,887 and a YTD Net Income of \$10,572. The General Fund balance after check approvals is \$71,803.84 and the Property Fund balance is \$100,068. There are several ongoing property projects for which this money will be utilized. Please refer to the Property Committee report for a detailed list.

I am recommending approval of the checks as presented. The only one potentially requiring additional explanation is the TK Elevator invoice from the June 4th elevator repair that wasn't paid last month because we were disputing the amount. The original invoice was \$1,445.51, but was reduced to \$990.34 as a result of our dispute. I will be working with Marlis and Tom Marty to see if we have an opportunity to contract with an alternative elevator maintenance and repair company beginning in 2024 (as our regular inspections are already paid through the end of this year).

• Kim Bright will follow up with Monona Plumbing on the repair of the protection device that was to be repaired free of charge along with the five-year inspection of the system.

Nancy Galhouse moved to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented; Tabatha Barnaby seconded. Motion carried.

Checks written were reviewed. Kim Bright moved to approve the checks as presented; Rachel Baker seconded. Motion carried.

Pastoral Report for September 2023

- Worship at the New Glarus Home is Sept 3.
- Worship at the Glarner Lodge service is Sept 7.
- An informational confirmation meeting for students, parents, and mentors will be held after worship on Sept. 10.
- A three-week book club on Tuesday, Sept. 5, 12 and 17, 9:30-11, conference office. Max Lucado, You Were Made for this Moment.
- Mission committee meeting Sept 13 ZOOM (We have combined both Joyful Hearts and El Salvador committees) Our focus for September will be Hawaiian Relief and NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness). Conni Bigler who is on the Green Co. Board for NAMI will speak briefly in worship on Sept, 10.
- I have a required Clergy meeting in Janesville September 14 9:30am -11:30am.

(Consistory meeting minutes cont'd.)

Property Report by Heidi Mondloch

- Interior and exterior painting has been completed
- Herock will start in September
- Driveway and front steps to church repair and/or replace in 2024-251. Consistory recommended that we may want to hold off on the driveway until we decide what to do with Zwingli House.
- Removal of tree by Zwingli House and parking lot repair
- It appears the front sidewalk was damaged by lifts used by Livesey. Property Committee will check if they have insurance to cover the repairs.
- Property Committee will email meeting minutes to Consistory members.
- Order for round tables and chairs from Costco has been completed for \$6,000 of \$10,000 donated. Property will ask donor if the remainder can be reallocated to the general property fund.

Planned Giving Committee by Rachel Baker

Planned Giving recommends to the Consistory a disbursement of \$200 to the General Fund from Benevolence to the New Glarus Home Auxiliary Board. Shelly Johnson moved to approve the recommendation; Kim Bright seconded. Motion carried. (Jessica Swan abstained.)

PG recommends to the Consistory a disbursement of \$600 to the General Fund from Christian Ed for the Art and Science Camp. Shelly Johnson moved to approve the recommendation; Kim Bright seconded. Motion carried. (Heidi Mondloch abstained)

Old Business

Shelly Johnson and Kim Bright, on behalf of the Cemetery Committee, met with Village Administrator Lauren Freeman to develop a transition plan to include the Village, Town of NG, and Swiss Church. A joint statement is being prepared to share with the community.

New Business

- Heidi Mondloch announced that the Mission Committee is planning a larger "Blessing Bazaar" in conjunction with the Cookie Walk.
- Jessica Swan is organizing a trip to Day Chola Camp (formerly Pilgrim Camp) for confirmands.
- Kilby Melody Ace will handle preparations. Shelly Johnson and Tabatha Barnaby will coordinate the daily activities. Silent auction will kick off and end mid-October.

Kim Bright moved that the Kilby proceeds go to the Property Committee for repair of the stairway and masonry work on the west side of the church; Nancy Galhouse seconded. Motion carried. Discussion of ways to make Swiss UCC more accepting and inclusive was tabled for a later date to be determined.

Closing prayer by Pat Pluss.

Rachel Baker moved to adjourn; Chris Kiesz seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:55 pm.


