I had never seen any like them before. He was as neat as could be, with crisp jeans, a flannel

shirt, and those distinctive boots. He appeared to be well cared for. While those boots caught my eye, it was something about his serene and kind facial expression that truly captivated me. I said to myself, "he must be a Christian."

I believe the look that seemed to radiate from him, came from some sort of inner strength he processed. I badly wanted to ask him if I could photograph him for our church newsletter... while something told me he would probably say – sure, the knowledge I have of HIPAA laws and patient privacy told me perhaps I should just sit still (that and I try not to have people think I am crazy).

I want the inner peace he seemed to possess and I want you to have it as well! As 2 Peter 1:3(The Message) says: "Everything that goes into a life of pleasing God has been miraculously given to us by getting to know, personally and intimately, the One who invited us to God. The best invitation we ever received!"

I believe that God provides us with all we need for life's journey, equipping us to be individuals of character who can confront any challenge with dignity and strength. Message from Consistory April 2024 --

Historic Preservation is defined as "the act or process of making possible a compatible use for a property through repair, alterations, and additions, while preserving those portions or features which convey it's historical, cultural or architectural values".

New Glarus has a history of preserving some of its historic buildings. Some buildings have been restored, and used as the original intent; such as the New Glarus Bakery, Puempel's Tavern, Swiss UCC, & Toffler's Restaurant.

Some buildings have been rehabbed, and morphed into other purposes: Klassy Feed Mill, New Glarus Lumber, Ruef's Meat Market, Zweifel Jewelry, Willi Law Office, just to name a few. Some buildings have been demolished, and replaced with new structures; the two downtown corner gas stations, implement dealer, car dealership, etc. And, like the New Glarus Hotel, and the Old Town Hall, these structures are currently in the rehab phases.

There are varying opinions about restoring historic buildings. Individuals that have Swiss roots, family that originated from New Glarus, and those that have moved to New Glarus because of the Swiss culture and traditions may feel it's important to preserve the past for historical reasons and for future generations. Others may look at preserving historic buildings as unimportant, or a waste of money; money that could be put to another use. Opinions are just that, opinions. There isn't a right or wrong.

The congregation of the Swiss UCC will soon be asked for input regarding the future of the Zwingli House (Haus), and its future. At last year's annual meeting, the congregation voted to not sell the Zwingli building & land, but to retain it as part of the Swiss Church campus, and decide it's future at a later date.

Whatever the future may be for the Zwingli House, fundraising will be part of the equation, and a solution will need to be agreed on by the Congregation.

Some options that may be considered:

Should the Zwingli House be restored?

- What would the function of this space be (office space, Sunday School, Youth Center, Community Room, museum...)?
- What would the cost be?

Should Zwingli House be demolished?

- What would the empty space be (green space, park like area with trees, Reflection garden with walking paths . . .)?
- Should a new structure be constructed at some point?
- What would the function of this new building be?

What are other options that you have?

- Are you willing to share your ideas?
- Are you willing to help fund raise?
- Are you willing to work together as a congregation to determine the solution?

This may be a very emotional subject for many, so working together and respecting everyone's opinion should be the most important decision that everyone makes.

What an exciting time to be a member of Swiss Church! Whatever the fate of Zwingli House, let us make it something great for the future generations of Swiss Church.


