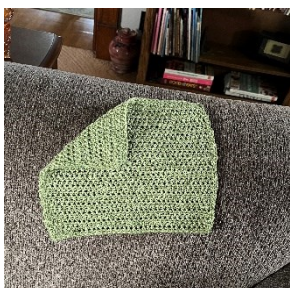

We do not have final expense numbers yet, but we wanted to share the income information (see below) with everyone before discussing options for future years. We have received feedback from some church members that they would like us to consider returning to the sit-down meal, so that we could have more fellowship time together. With the extreme crowds during Oktoberfest in New Glarus, we don’t believe that holding an in-person event at the church on Saturday would be a feasible option, so here are a couple of options to consider:

- We could move our Kilby supper to the 1st or 2nd weekend in October and offer both in-person dining as well as a carryout option. (Please keep in mind that some other churches in our area have their annual dinners on those weekends as well.) Additionally, if we were to pursue this option, we would likely not have a food stand during Oktoberfest and would lose out on those sales.
- We maintain the current structure serving take-out meals and “walking meatballs” during Oktoberfest weekend. The Kilby committee also recommends that we modify our tent hours on Saturday to noon – 9:00 pm to take advantage of the larger crowd at the festival, and then not have the food stand on Sunday but rather sell any remaining food in Fellowship Hall after church service.

Swiss UCC Consistory Minutes August 28, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Kim Bright at 6:30. Chris Kiesz led us in prayer.

Agenda

Items added to the agenda:

- Tree removal bid
- Pipe bids

Jon Ziltner moved to approve the amended agenda; Chris Kiesz seconded. Motion carried.

Consent Agenda

The consent agenda to approve the July minutes and Treasurer's Report was made by Jessica Swan; seconded by Rachel Baker. Motion carried.

Kim Bright moved to approve the checks written as presented: seconded by Rachel Baker. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report for Financial Statements ending July 31, 2024

July's income was \$16,466 and expenses were \$17,033 for a loss of \$567. Year to date income is \$145,853, which is \$5,689 over last year. Expenses were \$130,593, exactly \$1,000 more than last year's. Net profit YTD is \$15,560. OCWM contributions through July are \$6,834, which is about \$1,000 ahead of where we need to be to meet our \$10,000 pledge! Cemetery checking and savings balance are currently at \$16,852. For the first seven months of 2024, actual income is ahead of budget and expenses are under budget-thank you to everyone for supporting your Church!

Pastoral Report

- New Glarus Home Service Sept. 1

Property Committee Meeting Summary by Heidi Mondloch

- This fall the committee will rent a dumpster for \$440 to dispose of items in Zwingli that are moldy due to the large water leak in the spring. Many of the items are the wooden chairs that used to be used by Sunday School.
- The three bids for removing the tree by Zwingli and grinding the stump were \$2500, \$2400, and \$1260. The final bid came from Swiss Ropes and is the one Property Committee recommends. They would like Consistory to vote on the matter.
- Campus Clean-Up Day on October 5th from 9:00-12:00 to follow the Men's Breakfast. They will ask for adult volunteers and would like confirmands to help.
 - Trimming shrubs
 - Weeding
 - Cleaning the sanctuary
- Results from the sprinkler system water tests show a combination of acidic water from antifreeze expanding back into the water and bacteria. Both are causing corrosion. I contacted the Village Administrator to let her know about the high bacteria count in the water and received the following response:
 - I talked with Jason Borth, our water operator at the Village. He provided some additional context I wanted to share with you:

- The Church has a 6-inch lateral, which is roughly 200 feet. That section can hold 293 gallons of water at one time, and the Church used roughly 800 gallons of water total in July. That results in a significant amount of stagnant water sitting in the lateral for long periods of time.
 - The incoming Village water was sampled in the Church on the incoming feed to the backflow preventer next to the sprinkler system infrastructure in the utility room, which is at the end of the 6-inch lateral feeding from the south half of 5th Avenue. That means that the water you tested in not fresh water. The low usage/stagnant water causes you to not have fresh water for testing on the potable water side of your in-house infrastructure.
 - The Village regularly tests for coliform bacteria and E. coli bacteria in the drinking water at various locations set up by the DNR.
 - Jason also shared that in addition to having your sprinkler inspected every 5 years, you should also have it regularly flushed. If you have more questions for Jason, feel free to call him at 608-214-4424.
- In order to begin mitigation, the Property Committee is wondering how many quotes Consistory would like to see for a treatment plan. They recommend getting quotes only from Pertzborn Plumbing and Dave Jones Plumbing, not Monona Plumbing and Fire Protection. Tom Marty and the Church has been working with Monona for many years, tried to get them to address the problem and suggest solutions, and they were not able to provide any help other than replacing corroded pipes as they leaked.

Nicole Sidwell moved to accept the recommendation of the Property Committee regarding the tree removal; Jon Ziltner seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business

- The Village of New Glarus and Swiss Church have had three meetings regarding the transfer of the cemetery from Swiss Church to the Village. The transfer is progressing nicely.
- Consistory will approve a safe conduct policy at the September meeting.
- Kim Bright will seek second bids on equipment needs for online services.

Rachel Baker moved to adjourn; Chris Kiesz seconded. Motion carried.
Meeting adjourned at 7:06 p.m.
