A Message from Our Pastor, Pat Pluss ...



How appropriate that Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day this year! What a better reminder for us that Lent is all about love. It is a time to truly

focus on the love our Savior has for each of us. It is a time to be intentional about growing in our faith so we might come to know the depths of that love. The Apostle Paul said it beautifully in **Ephesians 3:17-18** "I pray that you being rooted and established in love, may have power, together



with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ!"


The Christian observance of Lent is 40 days and starts on Ash Wednesday (a day of confessing our sins, the use of ashes reminds us of our own mortality) and ends on the Saturday before Easter.

Typically, we do not count Sundays. Traditionally Christians chose 40 days to remember the 40 days that Jesus spent in the desert where he fasted and was tempted by the devil. Traditionally during Lent Christians pray more, fast, and are more intentional about giving to the poor. Lent often includes giving up of something such as meat, desserts, watching television, or gossiping!

I would like to encourage all of us to take on a discipline that will increase your understanding of God, and hopefully in turn will help you realize the depths of His love! One way I am suggesting to do this is to get a devotional book and read it daily through Lent. You could pick-up an Upper Room devotional, the church has these available on the counter top by the sound system box outside of the sanctuary. There are many devotional books on the stand between the two-sanctuary doors (where we keep our welcome bags). Use one of those devotional books and return it when you are finished. I will also have some devotional books available, Lent in Plain Sight by Jill J. Duffield. We will be using this book for our Tuesday book club, but it is also wonderful for personal use, or to share as a family. I will be ordering extra, so if you would like a book – please email me or leave a message at the church office. The cost of the book is \$10.

My prayer is all of us will make choices during Lent that draw us closer to God, then like the prayer of the Apostle Paul, come Easter, we will understand how wide and long, and high and deep, the love of Christ truly is!



A holiday meal was served before the meeting. Meeting called to order by Kim Bright at 6:25. Nancy Galhouse led us in prayer.

Approval of Agenda

Chris Kiesz moved to approve the agenda as presented; Nancy Galhouse seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of November Minutes

Shelley Johnson moved to approve the November minutes with the following revisions:

- Christine Craven, who manages the All God's Children Program for Swiss Church, requested a transfer of \$17,680 in the AGC restricted account to the Swiss Church All God's Children liaison in Mexico.
- Closed Session Minutes are to be separated from Open Session Minutes and are not for publication.

Tabatha Barnaby seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report by Shelly Johnson</u>

Giving was down again in November while expenses remained pretty constant, resulting in a net loss for the month of \$2,805 which leaves us in the black for the year by just \$1,008. However, December is typically our strongest month of the year for donations, and we have five Sundays in December this year so I'm confident that we'll end the year strong.

If you compare our YTD results thru November from 2022 to 2023, our income is only about \$2,000 below this time last year but our expenses are nearly \$11,000 higher. I expect some of that to moderate in December but have accounted for those higher expenses in our 2024 draft budget which we'll be reviewing at the Consistory meeting.

The church remains financially strong with a General Fund balance of \$67,447 and a Property Fund balance of \$91,698 - along with our cash reserves and CD. Additionally, we are nearly to our \$10,000 goal for OCWM with a current balance of \$9,420.

Heidi Mondloch moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; Tabatha Barnaby seconded. Motion carried.

Shelly Johnson moved to approve the checks as presented by Marlis Silver; Rachel Baker seconded. Motion carried.

Kim Bright moved to adjourn; Shelly Johnson seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:42 p.m.


