Our rule was they could search before church, but of course if they didn't find it in time, the search would continue after worship.

I will never forget one particular year, I simply placed the basket on their bedroom dresser – right on top, in clear sight. I thought it would be easily found, however the search continued after church until finally I relented and gave hints to where the "hidden" basket was!

Treasurer's Report by Shelly Johnson

Swiss Church finished the 2023 year strong with approximately \$41,000 in donations received in December. Total annual income for the church was \$246,572.89 (about \$8,400 below budget), but the lower income was off-set by lower expenses of \$226,508.38 (about \$11,750 below budget). The resulting Net Income for 2023 was \$20,064.51 which was \$3,353.51 ahead of budget. The full year-end report will be published in the Annual Report.

Rachel Baker moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; Ron Legler seconded. Motion carried.

Tabatha Barnaby moved to approve the checks written as recorded by Marlis Silver; Nancy Galhouse seconded. Motion carried.

Ron Legler provided update on the pipe leak issue. This is still an ongoing project. Property Committee and Tom Marty will continue to investigate further. Consistory will await potential recommendations from Property Committee.
