table he started eating right away. His mother quickly asked him the wait until they said a prayer. The little boy replied, "We don't need to pray at Grandma's house. She knows how to cook."

The older I get the more I love the holiday of Thanksgiving. Perhaps it is because the older I get the more grateful I am, or maybe it is because the focus is so simple: food, family, and gratitude! It is a reminder to be intentionally thankful.

But access to clean water means education, income and health - especially for women and kids.



Swiss UCC is proud to join with Charity Water and make a goal of totally funding a clean water well for an area of need!

Here is a note from the Charity Water website: **"The 100% Model"**: When charity water began, we made a bold promise: 100% of public donations would go directly to fund sustainable clean water projects. We'd even pay back credit card fees, meaning if a donor gave \$100 with a credit card and we got only \$97, we'd make up the \$3 and send the full \$100 to provide clean water for people in need. Since we treat the clean water projects and operations sides of our business differently – separate purposes, separate fundraising goals and separate bank accounts, we can guarantee that every public dollar donated helps bring clean water to people in need. And so far, more than 1 million people from 100+ countries have given in this way!

Swiss UCC Mission Committee will be working diligently to raise funds – hopefully by Easter 2025 to provide a clean water well for an area in need! The Blessing Bazaar and Christmas Tree sale are our first two projects!

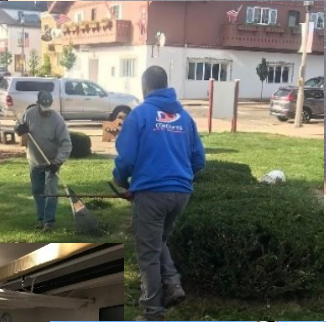
Universal Prayer for Veteran's Day --

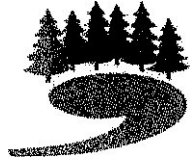

Dear Swiss United Church of Christ,

Gifts of congregations like yours to OCWM Basic Support make it possible for our Conference to support and strengthen local churches and leaders. We do this through programs like the recent Regional Youth Event.

Over the summer, young people from Wisconsin and neighboring states gathered at Augustana College in Rock Island, Illinois, for an event called "Love is Greater than Fear." Many came from congregations with few teenagers. But at the Regional Youth Event, they connected with peers who shared common values.

Some came with a feeling of vulnerability. Some had not been away from home or their families before. Some faced some anxiety; everyone reached out with a sense of acknowledgement and acceptance of this vulnerability. "I found the care and support beautiful to watch," said Lisa Hart, associate conference minister for faith formation and justice ministries. "Church at its best!"

One of the many highlights of RYE was the shared focus on what binds us, rather than what sets us apart. The young people celebrated their individuality while acknowledging their collective journey, finding strength and comfort in the realization that each of us faces unique struggles.

"The Many" provided a unique worship experience that combined movement and experiential prayer practices. Another moving episode was the Flamy Grant Concert, a memorable first experience for many with a drag performance, filled with faith testimonies and an expansive idea of God's love.

Young people engaged in a service project with Church World Service, assembling 500 CWS Period Packs. This initiative was a part of a broader focus to ensure that menstrual hygiene products are accessible to those in need. "I was inspired by the dedication and giving spirits of the youth," said Rachel Kessel of CWS. "They had so much fun with this project, and they really knew that they were making a difference with the local and global communities."

Swiss UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes September 25, 2024

Absent: Rachel Baker

The meeting was called to order by Kim Bright at 6:32. Pat Pluss led us in prayer.

Agenda:

Heidi Mondloch moved to approve the agenda; Jon Ziltner seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of Consent Agenda and Checks

Chris Kiesz moved to approve consent agenda; Nicole Sidwell seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report for Financial Statements ending August 31, 2024

Treasurer's Report for Financial Statements ending August 31, 2024 Actual income for August was \$14,418 and expenses were \$20,908 for a net loss of \$6,440. Year-to-date income is \$160,270 and expenses are \$151,500 for a net profit of \$8,770. Last year through August the net profit was \$8,752 almost the same as for 2024. OCWM contributions are over 80% of the pledged amount of \$10,000. Cemetery checking and savings account have a balance of \$15,788. The only expense in August that was unusually large and unbudgeted was for the replacement of a section of piping for the fire sprinkler system at a cost of \$2,125. Respectfully Submitted,

Old Business:

1. Discussion of Property Insurance

Discussed property insurance quotes by Church Mutual and Mosher and Associates. We currently have Insurance Board; however, our agent is out of state. Our current deductible is \$5,000, current premium is \$19,585 with a 10% increase expected next year. Church Mutual has premiums, but a much higher deductible. Insurance on Zwingli is currently approximately \$4,000. We can have liability insurance without covering the building. We have had no problems with claims in the past with Insurance Board.

Kim Bright moved to stay with our current carrier, Insurance Board; Heidi Mondloch seconded. Motion carried.

Heidi Mondloch moved to reduce coverage on Zwingli to only liability insurance; Nicole Sidwell seconded. Discussion proceeded about the possibility of the need to insure the contents of the building. Verified that gas and water are turned off, electrical is still in place for outdoor lights to prevent vandalism. Motion carried.

2. Pastor's Report

- Pat provided an update on the confirmation schedule.
- Pat requested time off on October 8 and 9. No vote required.
- Pat reported that a meal train will be provided when a church member returns home from the hospital after an extended stay.
- Discussion about hosting an anti-human trafficking seminar provided by the Green County Abuse Prevention Team.

Jessica Swan moved to host the human tracking seminar at SUCC on October 16; Ron Legler seconded. Motion carried.

Additional Old Business

- **Update on pipe issue:** None of the leaks have been in the antifreeze portion of the sprinkler system, there have also been no leaks in the area where there is water flow. Another meeting will be held on 10/1. Ahern Plumbing was recommended by Dave Jones Plumbing.
- **Nursery update:** There was a gap found in the insulation, this will be corrected.
- **Church Clean Up:** Scheduled for October 5.
- **Cemetery Update:** Last two meetings have been productive. The village has approved \$200,000 in borrowing in addition to our funds to seed an endowment fund.
- **Stewardship:** On hold until fall meeting
- **Update on Music/Online Taping Supplies:** Reviewed the requests from Ben for needed equipment. Kim Bright provided update after looking at online company called Sweet Water for pricing of the supplies. Kim put together a purchase order request to present to consistory. Planned Giving (innovative ministries) is able to provide additional funding above the \$1000 that is budgeted which is \$522.00.

Jessica Swan moved to approve funding of \$1522.00 for purchase of equipment that is currently being borrowed from Ben; Jon Ziltner seconded. Motion carried.

- **Update on signing of document for background checks:** All documents have been signed. Jessica Swan will follow up with Nicole Sidwell and Pat Pluss to proceed with initiating background checks for Sunday School teachers, Confirmation sponsors, and Sunday morning daycare provider.
- **Pulpit Supply:** Discussed options for guest pastors and the possibility of developing a contract for professional pastor to fill in when Pat isn't available.
- **Sanctuary Screen:** Table until more information is acquired.
- **Library Update:** No further information available at this time.
- **Memorial Gift:** Consistory reviewed Planned Giving bylaws. Jon Ziltner will inform Planned Giving of the memorial gift.

New Business

- **Handicap Parking Permits:** Marlis renewed 4 handicap parking permits for members to use to assist members of the congregation with mobility/community access. Chris Kiesz will announce this during church.
- **Access to Church during festivals:** Kim Bright met with the police department regarding 4th Avenue being blocked off recently and church members not being able to access parking during service. Kim spoke with Jeff at the police department and was provided assurances that we will have access to parking for church members during services.
- **Kilby Counters:** Heidi Mondloch will complete Kilby Count.
- **Safe Conduct Policy:** Heidi Mondloch will read and summarize prior to next meeting.

Motion to adjourn at 7:40 PM by Kim Bright; all voted in favor.
