enjoy a time of fellowship together as well.



Consistory Trying to Make it More Inviting to Serve on Consistory

Over the last 30-40 years some of us likely remember the dreaded 2.5-hour Consistory meeting. Lengthy agendas and meetings that seemed to drag on forever, going over the tedious and repetitive monthly tasks of running a small rural church. A byproduct of the experience was often to see, or more accurately, no longer see some of our Consistory members in church after their 3 year "sentence" was completed. They were exhausted by the experience. Another byproduct of those times was making recruitment of new Consistory members very challenging. There have been times when Consistory positions would remain unfilled because there weren't enough members interested in filling them.

For several years we've been trying to change that. We may never see the day of competitive votes for Consistory positions because there are more candidates than positions. But we are trying to make the experience less tedious so members readily step up when invited. Returning to serve on the Consistory after taking some time off upon completing a term is happening more frequently. "Many hands make light work" is a proverb that dates to the 1300s, and we are trying to embrace it today to make Consistory service enjoyable.

We do it in several small ways. We highly respect the Committee structure, and try to remain humble enough to respect the knowledge, research and recommendations from those groups. Members join those Committees because they have interest in those areas of our church life. Then they spend their meeting time focused on the issues relevant to those areas. Why would Consistory members, who spend just a fraction of the time thinking about those issues that the Committee does, then go on to second guess them? The Consistory ultimately "owns" the decisions about our church life and the financial implications for them. But, following the research and recommendations from those Committees is usually the wisest choice.

And the benefits are multiple; We have Committees that remain active and engaged because they know their work and recommendations are valued. The role of Consistory is streamlined, to include just a review of the Committee work. The research has been done, so Consistory can focus on issues of alignment of the recommendations to mission, budget, regulatory requirements, etc. The streamlined process helps keep Consistory meetings shorter, the goal is one hour. And most importantly, we generally will achieve better outcomes because we've followed the advice of the "experts" within our Congregation. We hope all our members will consider serving on one of our fourteen Committees, or Consistory. We are confident you will find it surprisingly gratifying, even enjoyable!

Swiss UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes July 24, 2024

Kim Bright called the meeting to order at 6:30. Pat Pluss led us in prayer.

Agenda

Chris Kiesz moved to approve the agenda as presented; Heidi Mondloch seconded. Motion carried.

Consent Agenda

The consent agenda to approve the June minutes, Treasurer's Report, and checks written was made by Nicole Sidwell; seconded by Jon Ziltner. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report for Financial Statements ending June 30, 2024

- Income for June was \$18,202 compared to \$15,594 for last year. Expenses were \$17,686 which is \$2,538 less than June 2023, leaving a net income of \$516 versus a loss of \$4630 last year.
- Cemetery checking and savings have a balance of \$18,791.
- For the six months ending June 30, income is up \$10,231 and expenses are down \$243 leaving a net income of \$10,474 more than in 2023. The actual net income YTD is \$16,159.
- The only expense that was considerably higher this year than last year was for property maintenance and repair, \$5,634 compared to last year of \$1,046.

 area. Our plans include painting and adding a smart TV to live stream the services.
- Healthy Cooking Class is scheduled next Wednesday, July 31 to be held in fellowship hall with 21 people signed up.
- NGH service is scheduled for Sunday, August 4 and Glarner Lodge service Thursday, August 8.
- September 8 Sunday School kickoff with the blessing of school goodie bags.

Property Committee Report by Heidi Mondloch

- A leaking pipe was replaced in Fellowship Hall on July 8 and a water sample was taken. Results of the water test should be available for members of the Property Committee at their August meeting.
- Because the church has frequently been found unlocked, the Property Committee will seek bids on recoding and rekeying the entrances to the church. Consistory will then decide who gets the new codes and keys.
- Tom Marty and Terry Roth will seek to find out why the radiator in the proposed nursery is not working and acquire a small airconditioning unit.
- Terry Roth will get quotes for the tree removal.

Old Business

- Yearly employee reviews of Diane Elmer and Marlis Silver have been completed. Both were found to be exceptional employees, achieving meets expectations and exceeds expectations in all categories of the review process.
- Praesidium will conduct background checks on any volunteers having contact with children during the church year.

New Business

- Kim Bright will acquire a list of equipment loaned to the church by Ben Bedward which we can then purchase for our own use.
- Christine Craven will hold a book sale on the church's green space across from the park on September 1 with proceeds going to the All God's Children mission.
- Discussion was had regarding the use of audiovisual equipment during church services.

Rachel Baker moved to adjourn; Chris Kiesz seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:41 p.m.
