A Message from Our Pastor, Pat Pluss ...

My husband Dave isn't really big on sweets. He'll have the occasional cookie

or a small slice of cake, but he almost never asks me to bake anything just for him. The one exception? Lemon meringue pie. It is his favorite, so for his birthday I make one each year.



Making lemon pie starts with tart, sour lemons – the kind that can make you pucker just from the smell. But once you add sugar and carefully follow the recipe, the turns into something sweet and delicious.

In a lot of ways, life is like that. We all go through bitter moments, - hardships, disappointments, and challenges that sting. In those moments, it can be hard to imagine that anything good could come from them.


August Book Club is yet to be decided! If you have suggestions, please tell Pat.

As a member of our Swiss United Church of Christ's Consistory, one opportunity I enjoy is participating as a liaison member to the Historical Committee. Our monthly meetings provide me the opportunity to learn about the history of our church and the dedication of our members over time. It is inspiring to read and hear about the sacrifices people have made during tough times in their own lives to make a difference for our church.

Currently we are working on plans to celebrate several events connected to the life of our church. The Constitution of our Congregation will officially be 175 years old on June 25, 2025. This date was when the men of the colony of New Glarus and the settlement of Bilten met to organize as a congregation. The first Pastor was Wilhelm Streissguth, who had just arrived earlier that week on foot from Milwaukee. Our Committee has plans to honor this event on **June 22**, **2025**. **Included on that day will be a panoramic photo taken of our current congregation following church.** Please be sure to attend!

We will also celebrate the 125th Anniversary of the "Laying of the Cornerstone" of our current church building. We plan to celebrate this historical event on Sunday, August 31st. There will be special music and a "Cornerstone Coffee Cafe" that morning following the service.

We are also working on a pictorial display (similar to the Pioneer Cemetery display that was installed last summer near the kiosk) to honor the women of our church and community. This will especially honor the early immigrant pioneer women who have not been officially recognized for their contributions to our church and community. If you know of any photographs connected to the early New Glarus pioneer women, or women's groups from our church, our committee would appreciate looking at them to see if they might work into our display.

Hope to see you all soon at church and at these special events!

Mission Committee – Update on Activities

Here's an update on the mission work that has been going on in the first part of the year.

- In January we completed our project to raise \$20K for a clean water well.
 We decided on the location of Sierra Leone in Africa for our well. An informational display about the progress is in Fellowship Hall.
- We continue to support Green Cares and donated nearly \$800 in January.
- In February we collected \$2,200 for California wildfire relief and Valentines were sent out to our shut-ins.
- In March we created 80 pairs of shorts for our Britches for Boys project. Those were sent off to Michigan where they will be forwarded to Africa.
- The confirmands created and delivered gift bags for our shut-ins.

- ✤ In April we collected \$680 for earthquake relief in Myanmar and Thailand through our UCC conference.
- Our Easter breakfast free-will Offering collected \$180 for youth ministries.
- In May both the Planned Giving and the Mission committee purchased bikes to be donated to the New Glarus Bike Rodeo.

What all this means is that Swiss Church is doing God's work in many, many ways and in many, many places. "Thank you" all for your generosity in supporting the mission work of our church.

Swiss UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes April 23, 2025

Chris Kiesz called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. Chris lead us in prayer.

<u>Agenda –</u>

Jon Ziltner asked to add information to the agenda regarding the restricted fund_committee recommendations. Jessica Swan asked to add a discussion regarding_information shared with the congregation from the Wisconsin Council of Churches.

Jon Ziltner made the motion, Rachel Baker seconded to approve the amended agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Approval of Consent Agenda.

See below for approvals of checks and treasurer's report.

Motion made by Heidi Mondloch to approve the March consistory minutes; seconded by Rachel Baker. Motion carried unanimously.

Treasurer's Report for Financial Statements ending March 31, 2025 Income for March was \$24,394 and expenses were \$18,167 for a net income of \$6,228. Year to date net income is \$14,448, which is \$9,888 over projected. Income is \$2,876 over budget and expenses are \$7,012 under budget. General Checking Account balance is \$71,250 with a cash reserve of \$160,980. The Property Account has a balance of \$183,322 which includes the \$35,000 from the sale of land to the Village. The invoice of about \$23,000 for the work Aherns did on the fire sprinkler systems has not been received or paid yet. Through March OCWM has received \$2,816 in contributions toward our annual pledge of \$10,255.

Jon provided an update regarding the transfer of cash to the Vanguard money market account.

Discussion regarding checks: Rev. Mary Gafner's pay should be \$264, rather than \$164.

Chris Kiesz motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Ron Legler seconded.

Nicole Sidwell moved to approve the checks; Rachel Baker seconded.

Pastoral ReportDiscussed changing the dates of executive and consistory meetings to ensure that what is going into the Spire is more up to date. 
