A Message from Our Pastor, Pat Pluss . . .

The start of a new year always brings a burst of optimism. We make lists, set goals, and declare that this will be the year we finally get our lives organized, our bodies toned, and our habits perfected. At least, that's usually my plan. Of course, reality has a sense of humor. I laughed when I read a story of a woman whose husband had given her a new watch with a fitness tracker on it. She was excited to receive it and announced her goal of walking 10,000 steps each day.

On January 1st she told her husband she had already achieved her goal that day! How could that be he wondered, because she hadn't left the couch yet. She held up her wrist with a triumphant grin. "I wrapped it around the dog's tail, and he has been wagging it all morning."

We laugh because we recognize ourselves in the story. Our resolutions are often sincere, but the follow-through sometimes needs a little grace. Life gets busy. Habits slip. Good intentions wobble. And sometimes the dog ends up doing more "exercise" than we do.

While the New Year often brings resolutions-promises to do better, try harder, or change something about ourselves, perhaps a better way would be to shift the focus from "fixing ourselves" to living faithfully with God at the center". That is exactly what our January sermon series is all about: stepping into a new year grounded in God's presence and guidance.

I recently saw something on the Today show with Reverend Jeff Ryder that really stood out. He said his New Year's resolution is simply: a prayer asking God to help the world learn how to disagree better. I love this! It reminds me that resolutions don't have to be grand – they can simply be about hope, grace, and God's work in the world.

A new year isn't about perfection - it's about direction. It's about turning our hearts toward God again, even if we've wandered. It's about taking small, faithful steps, even if they don't always add up to 10,000. This January, let's embrace a fresh start-not by striving for perfection but by intentionally seeking God's guidance each day. Whether it is through prayer, kindness, or simply listening, we can take steps to live faithfully and with purpose, one day at a time.

We read in Philippians 3:13-14 - "Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."

Let's start this year not with pressure, but pressing on with prayer, hope and a renewed commitment to faithful living! I invite you to join us each week in January as we share a sermon series titled "Starting Fresh, Living Faithfully"!

May God grant you peace, good health, and a faithful heart as we step into the New Year!

The ashes, made from burned palm branches from the previous year’s Palm Sunday. It symbolizes mortality, grief, and the need for penance. Our church will observe Ash Wednesday, on Wednesday, February 18. A meal will be served in Fellowship Hall at 5:30 PM. The brief service will be held in the sanctuary starting at 7 PM. Please join us as we begin the Lenten journey together!

Swiss UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes November 12, 2025

Present in person: Kim Bright, Ron Legler, Heidi Mondloch, Nicole Sidwell, Gary Krahenbuhl, Jon Ziltner, Steve Rossing, Chris Kiesz

Guests: Diane Elmer, Kim Berg and Tom Purdy from Fusion Fly of Monroe

Present via Zoom: Pastor Pat Pluss, Rachel Baker, Jessica Swan

1. Call to order at 6:30 PM

2. Opening prayer lead by Pastor Pat Pluss

3. Approve agenda with additions added including initiation of the budget process, the potential for a church Christmas Card, discussion about the upcoming December consistory meeting, and addition of information provided by Diane Elmer. Jon moved to approve the agenda as edited and Gary seconded. All voted in favor.

4. Review and approve CONSENT agenda

a. Approve last month's minutes

b. Treasurer's report

c. Approve checks- Jon Ziltner reported that there are no significant changes in the checks.

Heidi Mondloch moved to approve the consent agenda, Jon Ziltner seconded, all voted to approve.

5. Spire article reminder

6. Pastor's report- please see attached report. Pastor Pat Pluss reported that it is roughly \$1,200 to send out postcards to the local communities. However, the postcards may not arrive in time for the upcoming holiday season without paying a rush charge. Discussed completing this at Easter. Discussed other options that may be less expensive if we have time to plan prior to Easter. This will be added to the Dec agenda (Easter card and mailing cost). Pat inquired if SUCC could host Dan Holmes on March 8, 2025 for a cost of approximately \$200. This will be taken to the Worship Committee.

7. Property Committee report

a) Odor update- it was noted that the basement currently smells better. Deep cleaning was completed.

b) Ahern/pipe update- feedback was provided a week ago by Ahern, Property Committee will meet next week to discuss. Bacteria was noted in the pipes/sprinkler system and recommendations were provided by Ahern.

8. Other committee reports

a) Chris Kiesz reported that she and Diane Elmer met with Fusion Fly to assess the church website. Two representatives from Fusion Fly attended the meeting this evening and stated that church is doing many things well, including having our own domain and using Gmail for professional use. The website has been copied to their server. Options presented by Fusion Fly included a two-year contract or services as needed. Site security and site maintenance are included in the two-year contract. 24/7 monitoring of the site is provided as are updates to the site. The cost per month would be \$95 or \$115 per month, with varying services provided with each of these plans. It is unknown where our currently site is being hosted and this will be explored. Kim Bright mentioned that having services such as this is helpful as our IT support is part-time and ongoing maintenance and access to the website have been current issues with our current system. Discussion of price comparison of our current service with those of Fusion Fly. We are currently paying approximately \$350 per year which doesn't include any training of staff or additional services such as upgrading the website. Fusion Fly will provide service and support as well as staff training. Pat inquired if an as needed training could be provided by Fusion Fly rather than a set number of hours or a contract. The cost per hour of training is \$115 per hour. Diane expressed willingness to be trained on how to update the website. Discussion was completed. Jessica Swan made motion to sign the \$95 per month plan for two years, seconded by Heidi Mondloch, all voted in favor. Chris Kiesz will follow up with Fusion Fly.

Old Business

9. Zwingli Committee update- They are meeting again; an update will be forthcoming.

8. Sanctuary screen update- Live Stream tech updates are in process, equipment has been purchased and is in the process of being installed.

9. Additional youth feedback on church performance-no additional feedback was noted this month. Discussed a confirmation and Sunday School alumni get together (youth event for all youth in church and their friends they would like to invite).

New Business

10. Planned Giving withdrawal, distribution- planned giving committee met several weeks ago. Jon described a large recent contribution and distributions that are being recommended for various needs around the church. Jon has also started working on the budget for next year and described current needs. Heidi Mondloch moved to approve the removal of \$35,000 from the planned giving endowment to be distributed per the recommendations of planned giving, seconded by Kim Bright, all voted in favor.

11. Release form for America’s Test Kitchen for use of Swiss Church in October was signed by Kim Bright.

12. Discussion of terms for consistory members. Discussed for the need to return to staggered terms. Jessica Swan, Chris Kiesz and Heidi Mondloch, are all in agreement to stay on for an additional two-year term. Three additional members are needed for three-year terms starting in February 2026.

13. Dec 10 is the second Wednesday of December. Consistory will meet at 6:30 PM, Executive will meet at 6:00 PM.

14. Move to adjourn at 7:59 PM by Rachel Baker, Jon Ziltner seconded, all voted in favor.

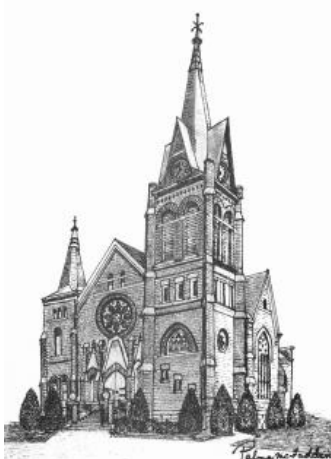
